Reflection for the Second Sunday of Advent

During this season, we can prepare ourselves with an Advent wreath that has three purple candles and one pink candle. We pray over this wreath nightly prior to having dinner with the family, asking God to help us recognize and to accept Jesus as our Lord. We ask to be made perfect in holiness as we prepare our inner selves for accepting the baby Jesus who is coming into our hearts at Christmas.

As children, we prepared our hearts by going to Confession during the Advent season. By attending Confession, we were cleansing our souls and opening our hearts to the love of Jesus who comes into this world to save us from temptations. Even though this year we are currently unable to attend a communal Penance service as a Saint Leonard family, we can ask for forgiveness in our daily Advent prayers and seek opportunities for individual Confession.

Additionally, we prepare our homes with the more traditional decorations, filled with lights and candles, to draw our attention for what is to come. These decorations may include a manger with Joseph, Mary, various animals, shepherds, and an angel overlooking the manger. Some may have a Yule log that depicts the fire that Christ will bring forth. These decorations are important during these times to uplift our spirits and to remind us that Advent, most importantly, is a time of preparing our heart, mind, body, and soul for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.
