Our partnership continues to evolve. Today I am sharing information on the organizational chart for St. Frances of Rome (see graphic). A brief description of each box is found below:

<u>Pastor and Associate Pastor:</u> Father Steven and I continue to enjoy celebrating Mass as well as serving the St. Frances community. We will both continue to spend scheduled time at St. Frances of Rome. If you need anything, please feel free to contact us.

<u>Finance Council and Parish Council:</u> Dutch and Mary will continue to lead the Finance and Parish Councils, respectively. I would ask all to consider becoming members of these two advisory groups. If you are interested, please let Father Steven know.

Business Manager: Bruce Hines has an office at Holy Trinity and oversees financial, maintenance, information technology and other support services.

Finance Manager: Terri Hayes has an office at Holy Trinity and leads financial management and accounting activities for both parishes.

Accounting Specialist: Allison Deaton, previously the Bookkeeper for Saint Frances of Rome and St. Leonard, has an office at Holy Trinity and handles financial transactions and HR matters associated with St. Frances of Rome, Holy Trinity and Holy Trinity-Clifton school.

<u>Finance Administrative Assistant:</u> Jill Greer has an office at Holy Trinity and also handles financial as well as HR matters for both St. Frances of Rome and Holy Trinity.

<u>Director of Facilities and Operations:</u> Steve King, previously the Parish Manager for Saint Frances of Rome and Saint Leonard, maintains offices at both Holy Trinity and St. Frances of Rome. He manages the planning for necessary improvements leading to facilities maintenance as well as operational items requiring attention at both HT and St. Frances of Rome.

<u>Director of Maintenance and Maintenance Team:</u> These four individuals will continue to have a periodic presence on the St. Frances of Rome campus in addition to their work for Holy Trinity.

<u>Director of Faith Formation and Pastoral Care:</u> Sharon Bidwell, previously the Director of Evangelization and Formation for both St. Leonard and St. Frances of Rome, is the Director of Faith Formation and Pastoral Care for St. Frances of Rome. She maintains an office at the Parish House for St. Frances of Rome.





Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A priest I know was asked by a door-to-door evangelist, "Do you believe in Jesus?" He answered, "Yes, I do. But if I may ask you," he continued, "Where do you experience Jesus' body and blood?" His interlocutor responded somewhat confusedly, "I don't. I just believe in him. That's all that is needed." Later my priest friend would relate to me, "The more I thought about it, that response struck me as totally inadequate. As human beings, we need to encounter Jesus' body and blood, not just hear about him and mentally believe. Otherwise, Jesus is just a ghost."

This week we see this central point as we arrive at the climactic moment of Jesus' teaching on the Eucharist. Jesus has established the importance of believing in him as the "bread of life come down from heaven." Belief deeply matters because it leads to a real, bodily encounter with Jesus through eating and drinking. That's why Jesus emphasizes to an almost outrageous degree the non-metaphorical necessity to "eat my flesh and drink my blood" (John 6:54). The real presence of Jesus' body and blood — he himself, truly, really, substantially — has been the Church's treasure since Holy Thursday. Internal belief in the heart and the ritual act of eating and drinking the Eucharist, the Church has stubbornly insisted on both, not just one or the other.

This is not meant to criticize non-Catholic Christians who deeply trust and love Jesus, nor is it a triumphal elitist claim about the Catholic Mass. Rather it is a humble, trusting acknowledgement that God in Jesus comes to us in a way most proper to human beings: in our hearts and our bodies, faith and the Eucharist.

First Reading:


We hear from Proverbs how Wisdom herself invites us to a deeper understanding of life. Is there someone in your family or among your friends who you consider a "wise" person?
