

Equestrian Order Invests New Knights from the Archdiocese of Louisville

Parishioner Sir Matthew Brotzge, and SFR Business Manager, Sir Bruce Hines among those knighted.

LACROSSE, Wis. – The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem invested four members of the faithful from the Archdiocese of Louisville into the Order at the North Central Lieutenancy's annual Investiture held in Lacrosse, Wis., on Oct. 6, 2024.

In a solemn investiture ceremony held at St. Joseph the Workman Cathedral in Lacrosse, Sir Matthew J. Brotzge, KHS, Sir John L. Campbell, KHS, Sir Gregory P. Herberger, KHS, and Sir Bruce C. Hines, KHS, were invested as Knights into the Order of the Holy Sepulchre by His Excellency, Archbishop Jerome E. Listecki, KC*HS, Archbishop of Milwaukee and Lieutenancy Coadjutor Prior. The investiture was followed by a memorial mass for the deceased members of the Lieutenancy who had died during the year.

The new knights will join the ranks of the Louisville-Owensboro Section of the Order. Sir John Campbell and Sir Gregory Herberger are parishioners at St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish, Louisville; Sir Matthew Brotzge is a parishioner at St. Frances of Rome, Louisville; Sir Bruce Hines is a parishioner at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish, Louisville.

The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem is a Pontifical Order of Chivalry under the protection of the Holy See. Its origins can be traced back to the year 1099 and the First Crusade. Members make a lifetime commitment to live a life of the Order's spirituality and make a commitment to the Order's mission of service and support for the Christians in the Holy Land. Today the Order numbers over 30,000 members worldwide. The North Central Lieutenancy covers the states of Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio and Wisconsin.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

From a young age, I loved winning at sports. I confess that winning was a bit of an addiction. It was probably coming from a deep desire for attention and affirmation from others. Nevertheless, it was a driving motivation for me. Baseball, soccer, track, table tennis, and whatever else I could find was a chance to win. Competition was my obsession.

Another John, and his brother James, demonstrate a kind of wildly competitive obsession when they dare to say to Jesus: **"Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory"** (Mark 10:37). Their audacity arouses an indigent reaction from the other apostles, who are clearly raw that these two are out to win the highest spots.

How does Jesus respond to us in our desires for greatness? The same way he does to James and John. He does not criticize them for their desire for glory. But he does highlight their ignorance (**"you do not know what you are asking."**). Then he invites them to be champions of true greatness: by drinking not the cup of worldly victory, but his cup of self-giving suffering love, to be the **"slave of all."** The true winners are slaves of love. This week, dare to tell Jesus what your ambitions truly are. Hear him call you to an even greater victory.
