SFR parishioners Diane and Ken Golliher have been serving the guests at the overnight winter shelter known as Room in the Inn Louisville, which is hosted by Christ Church Episcopal Cathedral. They wanted to share their thoughts about how this ministry has changed them.

"St. Frances of Rome's support for the Room at the Inn ministry gave us an opportunity to connect with our community in a different way. Working a few shifts at an overnight shelter for women and children allowed us to get to know a few of the people who spend their lives on the streets of Louisville. We made no significant contribution of money, time, or effort. We simply met, talked to, cooked for, and

broke bread with a few of the people we have all seen as we move about our city. We now have names and stories to go with faces. With that connection, it was difficult watching them walk back into that world the next morning, particularly in the bitter cold we have all experienced lately.

We assume that everyone wonders who the homeless people they see on our streets are and how they got into their circumstances. However, those thoughts probably don't stay with any of us very long; we just go back to our daily lives. That has changed for us. There was a recent TV segment on the homeless and we found ourselves looking for faces we knew. It was an entirely different sensation. The insight is unsettling, but it has proven beneficial to us personally. We will find a way to apply what we have learned."



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What is the secret to sharing in God's power to overcome our difficulties? Mary teaches us this in the prophecy of her pierced heart. This Sunday, the old man Simeon prophecies that when her son faces opposition, Mary's soul will be pierced by a sword. The seemingly pointless agony of a mother helplessly watching her son be mocked, tortured, killed and then cruelly desecrated in death by a spear — somehow this piercing of her heart releases a power by which "the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed" (Luke 2:35). What to make of this?

Whatever problems we currently face, the deepest threat is finally that evil thoughts are hidden in the human heart: hatred, envy, pride, lust, greed and so on. Behind every tyrant's injustice, for example, is a heart unpierced by love. Evil hides in our hearts. Mary's pierced heart, and its suffering love for her son, reveals and scatters these evil thoughts, and replaces them with love, forgiveness, generosity and peace.

This week, I invite us to ponder Mary's pierced heart. Her heart is quietly at work for us in the Church and world, exposing our evil thoughts and making a path for her son's divine love. This is how she gently cooperates in our salvation. Closed hearts are our biggest problem; love-pierced hearts are the ultimate power to overcome every difficulty.

Celebrating the Art of St. Frances of Rome

Over the next several weeks we will be featuring some of the beautiful and unique artwork that many of us love and admire within

our parish, but may not fully appreciate the history behind it. This week we begin with the statue of our patron herself, St. Frances of Rome.

Did you know that Louisville artist Ed Hamilton was commissioned by the parish to create and cast in bronze the statue of St. Frances of Rome. This honors the history of our parish from it's very early beginnings in the late 19th century as a maternity hospital. When the parish was established, it is thought that Bishop McCloskey named it "St. Frances of Rome in honor of St. Frances' devotion for the care of women in need."
