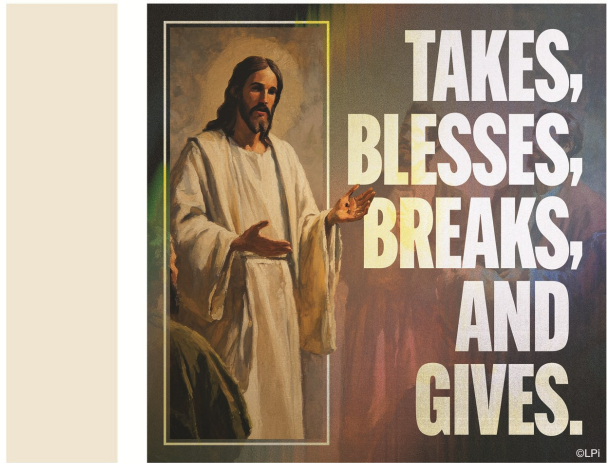

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A Catholic friend of mine occasionally says, “The Eucharist is not a noun. It’s a verb.” In so saying, he is making the point that the Eucharist isn’t simply Jesus’ bodily presence given to us in holy Communion. It also manifests the dynamic pattern by which Christ actively loves and saves us. He teaches us to cooperate with that pattern. This Eucharist actually embodies four verbs: Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. Let’s consider each one.

He **takes**: Do we acknowledge that we are totally in God’s hands? Do we receive everything in our lives as a gift, and act responsibly with it?

He **blesses**: Do we actively reflect that Jesus makes us holy in our baptism? Do we embrace our bodies and souls as temples of God, worthy of love, peace, and joy?

He **breaks**: Do we run from failure and disappointment, from getting old or being ignored? Are we too worried about getting hurt or sick? Do we embrace our sufferings with confidence?

He **gives**: Are we willing to make our lives a gift for others? Are we confident that we will always have enough love to give to others, that God will always provide enough for us? Do we rejoice in giving away what we have to others, expecting nothing in return? This is the dynamic life the Eucharist empowers us to live.

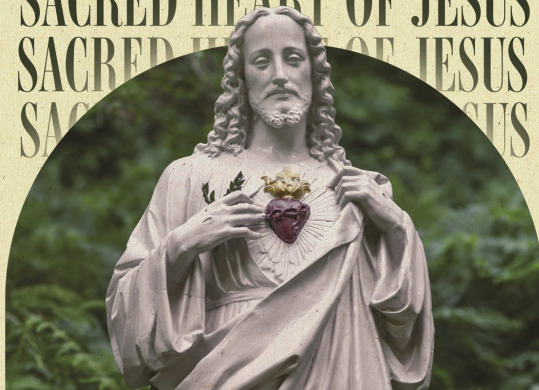


It's time to bring in those baby bottles you picked up around Mother's Day. Your donations to support the work of Little Way Pregnancy Center will help mothers receive

Pantry

NEEDS

On two consecutive days in late May, the pantry saw more than 50 visitors come in for groceries. To the best of anyone's recollection, it was a record.

At the same time, our delivery of USDA meat was the smallest many of us have seen. The meat came in as always on the third Friday of the month – when the pantry is closed – and two weeks later, we had only a few servings of USDA meat remaining, even as we scaled back how much we gave to each family.

On the bright side, our supplies of canned goods, especially vegetables, including green beans, corn and tomatoes, remains high.

The generous gift of toilet paper from St. Frances of Rome Church is finally near its end. That donation was a huge help.

This month, our needs are as follows:

- Frozen meat, especially chicken and ground beef.
- Canned soup
- Rice

- Canned beans, such as kidney, pinto, black, great northern, cannellini, garbanzo
- meat in a can such as Spam, tuna, chicken
- meals in a can like lasagna, ravioli, spaghetti and meatballs
- coffee, tea, soda
- milk, powdered milk and shelf-stable milk
- spices, cooking oil, butter
- baking supplies, including sugar, flour, baking soda, baking powder
- Sanitary napkins, tampons, pads
- deodorant
- shaving cream
- shampoo, conditioner
- soap, body wash
- diapers of all sizes except newborn and size 1.
- baby wipes
- adult diapers, all sizes
- cat food
- dog food
- folding grocery carts for those who walk or take the bus to the pantry.

Mission for the Week

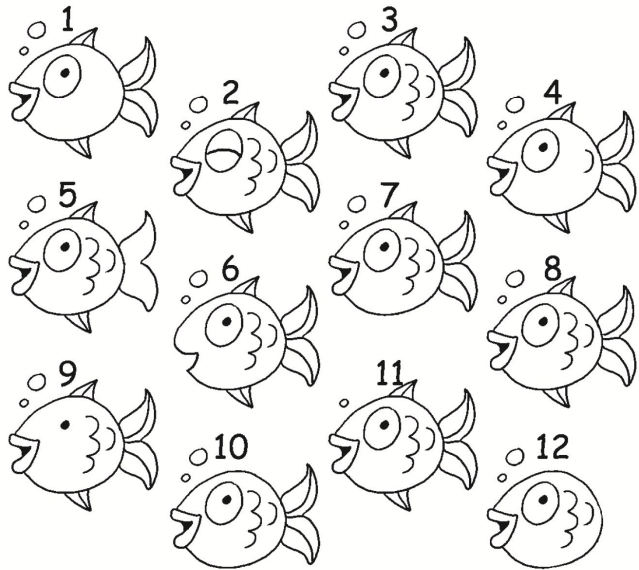
If God has blessed your family with plenty of food to eat, make sure you also give food to people who are hungry.
