Dear St. Frances of Rome Family,

This time of the year we are prepared for the changes in seasons. We are not always prepared for other changes that life brings us, especially when they are not planned or expected. This weekend I wish to inform you of several changes that will affect our parish community. The first is in regards to our Associate

Pastor Fr. Steven Henriksen. Father has served our community as well as St. Boniface as their Administrator for close to a year now. Earlier this week Archbishop Fabre granted Fr. Steven early retirement from parish and pastoral ministry. Fr. Steven will also be relocating to a new, private residence. I want to thank him for his ministry, presence, and his priesthood. Father's last day will be November 1. Please continue to keep Fr. Steven in your prayers.

Secondly, after 20 years of service in the Archdiocese, Mary Scott Herrington, who was recently hired to oversee our Senior Ministry initiatives, has decided to retire. Her last day will be Sunday, November 2. Please keep Mary Scott in your prayers as she transitions into a well deserved retirement. I am grateful for her many years of service and her willingness to help us here at St. Frances of Rome.

Finally, Sharon Bidwell who has served our community as a Faith Formation Director and most recently Parish Life Director, has accepted a position at her home parish of St. William, overseeing their Social Justice Outreach Ministry. I know this was a difficult decision for her, and I have assured her of my thanks and my full support. Sharon's last day will be Sunday, November 9.

This is a lot of change all at once, but I am confident that our Lord's will is being done and we will make this journey together. As a result of Fr. Steven's departure, Daily Mass will continue to be suspended. I will be speaking with the Archbishop and the Priest Personnel Board in mid October about the options we may have in replacing Fr. Steven. I have also met with our Parish Council this past Wednesday to discuss these transitions, and to make sure we are doing what is best for our community. Please keep us all in your prayers.

I am fully aware that this news and the unknown can cause feelings of fear and anxiety. We must trust that the Lord has us in the palm of his hand and that all will be well. We must all trust in the guidance of the Holy Spirit and navigate these waters together. Know of my prayers and please pray for me.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Dorothy Day, the great Catholic activist, doubted God's existence. At least in her early adult years. But something changed when after giving birth to her daughter, she experienced an overwhelming gratitude. She later described how, as she held her daughter, the only appropriate response was a kind of unlimited gratitude. She had done nothing to deserve such a gift — this tiny, miraculous life — but there she was, flooded with gratitude, completely undone by the love of such a Giver.

Something similar occurs in Luke 17:19 when Jesus tells a healed leper, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." This man had already received physical healing through his faith. But the moment of an even deeper transformation came when he turned back, fell at Jesus' feet, and gave thanks. Like Dorothy, this man's gratitude led him to encounter the Giver.

Isn't that what we want, too? Gratitude to God has the power to break our chains of sadness, bitterness, and disenchantment. It empowers us to step out of the prison of self-pity and into the reality of God's abundant love. It shifts our focus from what we lack to what we have received, from what wounds us to what heals us.

Where do we learn this? The Mass. The priest prays: "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks." Always. Everywhere. Not just when life is easy. Not just when prayers are answered as we expect. Gratitude is not a passive feeling; it is an act of faith. In the eucharist, we remember that Christ himself has given everything for us. And in this act of gratitude, we are healed.




